A BILL ENTITLED

2	Election Law - Petitions	and Ballot Issues -	Prohibited Actions

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from obtaining a signature on a petition by certain means; prohibiting a person from preventing, hindering, or delaying another person from signing a petition by certain means; prohibiting a person from taking certain actions against another person because of that person's contribution to a ballot issue committee; providing that a certain prohibition does not apply to certain peaceable activity; providing for certain penalties; and generally relating to prohibited actions relating to petitions and ballot issues.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 22 Article Election Law

- 24 (a) A person may not willfully and knowingly:

$\frac{1}{2}$	inducing another person to sign or not sign any petition;
3 4	(2) request, receive, or agree to receive, anything of value as an inducement to sign or not to sign any petition;
5 6	(3) misrepresent any fact for the purpose of inducing another person to sign or not to sign any petition;
7	(4) sign the name of any other person to a petition;
8	(5) falsify any signature or purported signature to a petition;
9 10	(6) obtain, or attempt to obtain, any signature to a petition by fraud, duress, [or] force, THREAT, MENACE, OR INTIMIDATION;
11 12 13	(7) PREVENT, HINDER, OR DELAY ANOTHER PERSON WHO HAS A LAWFUL RIGHT TO SIGN A PETITION FROM SIGNING A PETITION THROUGH THE USE OF FRAUD, DURESS, FORCE, THREAT, MENACE, OR INTIMIDATION;
14 15	[(7)](8) circulate, cause to be circulated, or file with an election authority a petition that contains any false, forged, or fictitious signatures;
16	[(8)](9) sign a petition that the person is not legally qualified to sign;
17	[(9)](10) sign a petition more than once; or
18	[(10)](11) alter any petition after it is filed with the election authority.
19	(b) Each violation of this section shall be considered a separate offense.
20 21	(c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to the penalties provided in Subtitle 10 of this title.

23 24	(A) BECAUSE OF ANOTHER PERSON'S CONTRIBUTION TO A BALLOT ISSUE COMMITTEE, A PERSON MAY NOT:
25	(1) HARASS OR COMMIT A CRIME AGAINST THAT PERSON; OR
26 27	(2) DEFACE, DAMAGE, OR DESTROY OR ATTEMPT TO DEFACE, DAMAGE, OR DESTROY THE REAL OR PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THAT PERSON.

- 1 (B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A PEACEABLE ACTIVITY 2 INTENDED TO EXPRESS A POLITICAL VIEW OR PROVIDE INFORMATION TO 3 OTHERS.
- 4 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A 5 MISDEMEANOR AND IS SUBJECT TO THE PENALTIES PROVIDED IN SUBTITLE 10 6 OF THIS TITLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 June 1, 2011.
