- 17 (b) Any person who willfully obliterates, damages, or removes any stake, 18 marker, monument, or other landmark set in the property of another person by any 19 civil engineer, surveyor, or real estate appraiser or any of their assistants, except if the 20 stake, marker, monument, or other landmark interferes with the proper use of the 21 property, is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be fined not more than
