# Real Property - Interference With Obliterating, Damaging, or Removing Property Markers - Penalty Increase

appraiser or any of their assistants except under certain circumstances; and

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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civil engineer, surveyor, or real estate appraiser or any of their assistants, except if the
stake, marker, monument, or other landmark interferes with the proper use of the
property, is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be fined not more than
[\$500] \$2,500.
