3 4	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7	(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
8	(H) "TRANSIT PASSENGER SHELTER" MEANS:

- 2 (a) The Department shall adopt regulations that prohibit environmental tobacco smoke in indoor areas open to the public AND IN TRANSIT PASSENGER SHELTERS.
- 5 (b) On or before September 30 of each year, the Department shall report, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly on:
- 8 (1) The enforcement efforts of the Department to eliminate 9 environmental tobacco smoke in indoor areas open to the public AND IN TRANSIT 10 PASSENGER SHELTERS during the prior year; and
- 11 (2) The results of these enforcement efforts.

- 13 (a) Subject to subsection (c) of this section and except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a person who violates a provision of this subtitle or a regulation adopted under § 24–507(a) of this subtitle:
- 16 (1) For a first violation, shall be issued a written reprimand by the 17 Secretary or the Secretary's designee;
- 18 (2) For a second violation, is subject to a civil penalty of \$100; and
- 19 (3) For each subsequent violation, is subject to a civil penalty not less 20 than \$250.
