AN ACT concerning 1 2 Criminal Law - Contraband - Telecommunication Devices - Penalties 3 FOR the purpose of making certain offenses relating to possessing, delivering, 4 concealing, or receiving a telecommunication device in a place of confinement a 5 felony; increasing certain maximum penalties; and generally relating to 6 telecommunication devices in places of confinement. 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 8 Article - Criminal Law 9 Section 9-417 Annotated Code of Maryland 10 (2002 Volume and 2010 Supplement) 11 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13

- 16 (a) (1) A person may not deliver a telecommunication device to a person detained or confined in a place of confinement with signs posted indicating that such conduct is prohibited.
- 19 (2) A person may not possess a telecommunication device with the 20 intent to deliver it to a person detained or confined in a place of confinement with signs posted indicating that such conduct is prohibited.
- 22 (3) A person may not deposit or conceal a telecommunication device in 23 or about a place of confinement with signs posted indicating that such conduct is

- prohibited or on any land appurtenant to the place of confinement with the intent that it be obtained by a person detained or confined in the place of confinement.
- 3 (4) A person detained or confined in a place of confinement may not knowingly possess or receive a telecommunication device.
 - (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a [misdemeanor] **FELONY** and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding [3] **5** years or a fine not exceeding [\$1,000] **\$3,000** or both.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2011.
