A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Council

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Council; 4 specifying the membership and staffing of the Council; requiring the Governor $\mathbf{5}$ to designate the chair or cochairs of the Council; requiring the Council to 6 perform certain duties and make certain recommendations; prohibiting 7 members of the Council from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing 8 the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Council to submit an 9 interim and a final report by certain dates; defining certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Maryland Electric 10 Vehicle Infrastructure Council. 11
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That:
- 14 (a) In this section, "electric vehicle" or "EV" means any mode of electric drive15 transportation.
- 16 (b) There is a Maryland Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Council.
- 17 (c) The Council consists of the following members:
- 18 (1) One member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the19 President of the Senate;
- 20 (2) One member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker 21 of the House;
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- (3) The Secretary of Transportation or the Secretary's designee;

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1 (h) (1) On or before January 1, 2012, the Council shall submit an interim 2 report of its work and recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of 3 the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

4 (2) On or before December 1, 2012, the Council shall submit a final 5 report of its work and recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of 6 the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
July 1, 2011. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30,
2013, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
abrogated and of no further force and effect.
