- FOR the purpose of providing that a member of the Anne Arundel County Board of Education is eligible for <u>nomination and</u> reappointment under certain circumstances; prohibiting an individual from serving as a board member for more than a certain number of consecutive terms <u>clarifying that a certain provision of law provides for the term of a member; making a certain stylistic change</u>; making certain conforming changes; and generally relating to the reappointment and terms of the members of the Anne Arundel County Board of Education.

13 14 15 16	(g) (1) The President of the Anne Arundel County Board of Education is entitled to receive \$8,000 annually as compensation and, except for the student member, the other board members are entitled to receive \$6,000 each annually as compensation.
17 18 19	(2) A student member who completes a full term on the board shall be granted a scholarship of \$6,000 to be applied toward the student's higher education costs.
