CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Motor Vehicles – Use of Text Messaging Device While Driving**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing that a certain prohibition against a person under a
4 certain age using a wireless communication device while operating a motor
5 vehicle does not apply to the use of a wireless communication device as a text
6 messaging device; clarifying that a certain prohibition against a person using a
7 text messaging device to write or send a text message while operating a motor
8 vehicle under certain circumstances includes a prohibition against writing or
9 sending an electronic message; making a certain technical correction; altering a
10 certain definition; and generally relating to the use of a text messaging device
11 while driving.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Transportation**

20 21–1124.

1 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

2 (2) “9–1–1 system” has the meaning stated in § 1–301 of the Public
3 Safety Article.

4 (3) “Wireless communication device” means[:

5 (i) A] A handheld or hands–free device used to access a wireless
6 telephone service[: or

7 (ii) A text messaging device].

8 (b) This section does not apply to [the]:

9 (1) **THE** use of a wireless communication device to contact a 9–1–1
10 system; **OR**

11 (2) **THE USE OF A WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICE AS A TEXT**
12 **MESSAGING DEVICE AS DEFINED IN § 21–1124.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

13 (c) A [holder of a learner’s instructional permit or a provisional driver’s
14 license] **PERSON** who is under the age of 18 years may not use a wireless
15 communication device while operating a motor vehicle.

16 (d) A police officer may enforce this section only as a secondary action when
17 the police officer detains a driver for a suspected violation of another provision of the
18 Code.

19 (e) (1) If the Administration receives satisfactory evidence that an
20 individual has violated this section, the Administration:

21 (i) May suspend the individual’s driver’s license for not more
22 than 90 days; and

23 (ii) May issue a restricted license for the period of suspension
24 that is limited to driving a motor vehicle:

25 1. In the course of the individual’s employment;

26 2. For the purpose of driving to or from a place of
27 employment; or

28 3. For the purpose of driving to or from school.

29 (2) An individual may request a hearing as provided for a suspension
30 or revocation under Title 12, Subtitle 2 of this article.

2 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

3 (2) "9-1-1 system" has the meaning stated in § 1-301 of the Public
4 Safety Article.

5 (3) "Text messaging device" means a hand held device used to send a
6 text message or an electronic message via a short message service, wireless telephone
7 service, or electronic communication network.

8 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a person may not use a text
9 messaging device to write or send a text message **OR AN ELECTRONIC MESSAGE**
10 while operating a motor vehicle in motion or in the travel portion of the roadway.

11 (c) This section does not apply to the use of:

12 (1) A global positioning system; or

13 (2) A text messaging device to contact a 9-1-1 system.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2011.
