Natural Resources - Oyster Poaching - Hearing

3 FOR the purpose of providing that a certain person who receives a citation for a 4 certain offense related to unlawfully taking oysters may have a certain license $\mathbf{5}$ revoked under certain circumstances; establishing certain grounds for the 6 revocation of a certain license; requiring the Department of Natural Resources 7 to hold a certain hearing under certain circumstances in accordance with the 8 Administrative Procedure Act; requiring the Department to revoke a person's 9 license to catch oysters under certain circumstances; authorizing certain aggrieved persons to obtain judicial review of a certain decision; prohibiting a 10 certain person from engaging or working in a certain fishery under certain 11 circumstances; and generally relating to unlawfully taking oysters and license 12 13revocation.
