- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – State Personnel and Pensions

16 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a member's contribution 17 rate is 5% of the part of the member's earnable compensation that exceeds the taxable 18 wage base for each year.

19 (b) The contribution rate of a member who is subject to the contributory 20 pension benefit under Part II of this subtitle is 2% of the member's earnable 21 compensation.

(c) The contribution rate of a member who is subject to the Alternate
 Contributory Pension Selection under Part III of this subtitle is:

- 7 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this [section,] SECTION:
- 8 (1) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 30, 2011, a member's contribution rate is 9 6% of the member's earnable compensation; AND

10 (2) ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2011, A MEMBER'S CONTRIBUTION 11 RATE IS 7% OF THE MEMBER'S EARNABLE COMPENSATION.

12 (b) After 16 years of service as a member, a member does not make any 13 further contributions.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectJuly 1, 2011.
