2 Election Law – Recall Elections – Felony Indictment or Conviction

FOR the purpose of adding a new article to the Maryland Constitution requiring the
 General Assembly to pass laws necessary to establish standards and procedures
 for recall elections for certain State officials who have been indicted for or
 convicted of a felony; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of
 the State for their adoption or rejection.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses 13 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

ARTICLE XVII-A – RECALL ELECTIONS

15 **1.**

16 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL PASS LAWS NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH 17 STANDARDS AND PROCEDURES FOR RECALL ELECTIONS FOR THE FOLLOWING 18 STATE OFFICIALS IF THE OFFICIAL IS UNDER INDICTMENT FOR OR CONVICTED 19 OF A FELONY:

20(1) THE GOVERNOR, LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, ATTORNEY21GENERAL, AND COMPTROLLER; AND

22 (2) AN ELECTED OR APPOINTED MEMBER OF THE GENERAL 23 ASSEMBLY.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 2 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act 3 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the 4 Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not 5 apply.

6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section 7proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the 8 gualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November, 2012 9 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. 10 At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the 11 12Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the 13 Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article 14XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance with 1516 Article XIV.
