5 (H) A JUDGE OR A DISTRICT COURT COMMISSIONER MAY NOT 6 AUTHORIZE THE PRETRIAL RELEASE OF A DEFENDANT WHO CANNOT PROVIDE 7 DOCUMENTATION ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT CERTIFYING THAT THE 8 INDIVIDUAL IS LAWFULLY PRESENT IN THE UNITED STATES IN ACCORDANCE 9 WITH FEDERAL LAW.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
