# 1 AN ACT concerning

# Health Occupations – Temporary Volunteer Dentist's License, Temporary Volunteer Dental Hygienist's License, and Temporary Dental Clinic Permit

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing a temporary volunteer dentist's license, a temporary  $\mathbf{5}$ volunteer dental hygienist's license, and a temporary dental clinic permit under 6 the State Board of Dental Examiners; establishing certain procedures for  $\overline{7}$ dentists, dental hygienists, and bona fide charitable organizations to apply for 8 certain licenses and permits; establishing the scope of practice of certain 9 licenses; prohibiting the Board from requiring continuing education as a condition for the issuance of certain licenses; requiring temporary dental clinics 10 to have a medical emergency plan, certain equipment, and certain safeguards; 11 12specifying certain powers of the Board; altering certain definitions; defining a 13 certain term; making a stylistic change; and generally relating to the establishment of a temporary volunteer dentist's license, a temporary volunteer 14 dental hygienist's license, and a temporary dental clinic permit. 15
