11 WHEREAS, On January 13, 1903, the first Korean immigrant arrived in the 12 United States; and

WHEREAS, These first immigrants and their descendants faced and overcame difficult conditions and created a successful and distinct community that has fought for our nation's freedom and democratic way of life and has promoted free enterprise, a commitment to hard work, and an intense value for education; and

  economic strength, and proud heritage; and
- WHEREAS, The contributions of Korean Americans can be seen in business, academia, engineering, medicine, literature, journalism, military service, and other areas of achievement in Maryland; now, therefore,

#### HOUSE BILL 439

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## **Article – State Government**

4 **13–410.** 

## 5 IN RECOGNITION OF THE ECONOMIC AND CULTURAL CONTRIBUTIONS 6 THAT KOREAN AMERICANS HAVE MADE TO THE STATE, THE GOVERNOR 7 ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM JANUARY 13 AS KOREAN AMERICAN DAY.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2011.
