A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Transportation Trust Fund Protection Act

3 FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to establish a Transportation Trust Fund to be used only for purposes relating to 4 5 transportation with a certain exception; prohibiting the reversion or crediting of 6 any part of the Transportation Trust Fund to the General Fund or a special 7 fund of the State; requiring that certain taxes, fees, charges, and revenues be 8 credited to the Transportation Trust Fund; authorizing the use of funds in the 9 Transportation Trust Fund for defense or relief purposes if the State is invaded 10 or a major catastrophe occurs and the Governor and the General Assembly take certain actions and provide for the repayment of the funds; and submitting this 11 12 amendment to the qualified voters of the State for their adoption or rejection.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

Article III - Legislative Department

- 1 (A) THERE IS A TRANSPORTATION TRUST FUND.
- 2 (B) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, THE 3 FUNDS IN THE TRANSPORTATION TRUST FUND MAY BE USED ONLY:

- THE STATE IS INVADED BY LAND, SEA, OR AIR; OR
- 23 (II) A MAJOR CATASTROPHE OCCURS;
- **(2)** THE GOVERNOR: 24
- 25 (I)PROCLAIMS A STATE OF EMERGENCY;
- 26 (II)DECLARES THAT USE OF THE FUNDS FOR DEFENSE OR RELIEF PURPOSES IS NECESSARY FOR THE IMMEDIATE PRESERVATION OF THE 2728 PUBLIC HEALTH OR SAFETY; AND
- 29 (III) PROPOSES A PLAN TO REPAY THE TRANSPORTATION 30 TRUST FUND, WITHIN 5 YEARS AFTER THE USE OF THE FUNDS, FOR ANY
- 31 AMOUNTS USED UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THIS SUBSECTION; AND

- (3) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, BY LEGISLATION PASSED ON A YEA AND NAY VOTE SUPPORTED BY THREE-FIFTHS OF ALL THE MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH OF THE TWO HOUSES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, CONCURS THAT THE USE OF THE FUNDS FOR DEFENSE OR RELIEF PURPOSES IS NECESSARY AND APPROVES THE REPAYMENT PLAN PROPOSED BY THE GOVERNOR.
- (F) LEGISLATION PASSED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY UNDER SUBSECTION (E)(3) OF THIS SECTION SHALL CONTAIN ONLY THOSE PROVISIONS REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH SUBSECTION (E)(3) OF THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November, 2012 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
