FOR the purpose of providing that a telephone company may not be required to
distribute a certain telephone directory to an address in the State unless the
property owner or an occupant requests the directory; requiring a telephone

company elects not to deliver a print telephone directory to each the customer at
an address in the State; requiring a telephone company to deliver a print
telephone directory to a customer at no cost to the customer under certain
