A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Citizen's Tuition Protection Act

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain powers and duties of the presidents and certain governing bodies of certain public institutions of higher education relating to 4 $\mathbf{5}$ the setting of tuition; prohibiting certain public institutions of higher education 6 from charging an undergraduate student who is a citizen of the United States a 7tuition rate that is higher than the tuition rate charged an undergraduate 8 student who is not a citizen of the United States; requiring the governing body 9 of certain institutions of higher education to adopt certain policies; defining certain terms; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to 10 tuition charged by a public institution of higher education. 11

1 (2) (i) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (4) of this 2 subsection AND EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 15–113 OF THIS ARTICLE, the Board of 3 Trustees shall assess each student who is not a resident of this State, in addition to 4 the student tuition and fees paid by residents, an out-of-state fee at least equal to 60 5 percent of the amount of State support for the College per full-time equivalent 6 student.

(ii) The Board of Trustees may waive the out-of-state fee as
determined in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for a student who is employed by a
business located in the City of Baltimore.

10 (iii) Any student attending the College who receives a tuition 11 waiver as provided by subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph shall not be included as an 12 in-State resident for computation of State aid to the College in accordance with § 13 16-512 of this subtitle.

14 (iv) The Board of Trustees may waive the out-of-state fee as 15 determined in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for a student who resides in the 16 State but does not meet the in-State residency requirement for tuition purposes and 17 has moved to the State as an employee or a family member of an employee as part of 18 the Base Realignment and Closure process as announced by the United States 19 Department of Defense.

20 (v) Any student attending the College who receives a tuition 21 waiver under subparagraph (iv) of this paragraph shall be included as an in–State 22 resident for computation of State aid to the College in accordance with § 16–512 of this 23 subtitle.

(3) For purposes of this subsection, the number of full-time equivalent
students is the quotient of the number of student credit hours produced in the fiscal
year divided by 30.

(4) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 15–113 OF THIS ARTICLE, A
student who is not a resident of the State shall be considered a resident for purposes of
assessing tuition and fees to the extent that such student would be eligible for
in-county status under the provisions of § 16–310(a)(3) or (f) of this title.

- (5) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 15–113 OF THIS ARTICLE,
 THE Board of Trustees shall set tuition and fees for students who are residents of
 counties in this State other than Baltimore City at the same rate as the tuition and
 fees charged to students who reside in Baltimore City.
