15 16 17 18 19	(a) An individual who fails to comply with the relief granted in an interim peace order under § 3–1503.1 of this subtitle, a temporary peace order under § 3–1504(a)(2) of this subtitle, or a final peace order under § 3–1505(d)(1)(i), (ii), (iii), or (iv) of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject [, for each offense,] to:
20 21	(1) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisonment not exceeding 90 days or both; AND
22 23	(2) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$2,500 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH.

- 1 (b) A law enforcement officer shall arrest with or without a warrant and take 2 into custody an individual who the officer has probable cause to believe is in violation 3 of an interim peace order, temporary peace order, or final peace order in effect at the 4 time of the violation.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2011.
