BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Transportation 16-107.(a) The application of a minor for a license shall be cosigned by: A parent or guardian of the applicant; [or] (1)
