# Harford County – Towing and Removing Vehicles – Property Return Agreement

FOR the purpose of prohibiting in Harford County the Harford County Sheriff's Office
or any police department from authorizing a person to tow or remove a certain
vehicle unless the person enters into a written agreement with the Harford
County Sheriff's Office or police department to return to the vehicle owner, on
request of the owner, certain property in or on the vehicle; defining a certain
term; and generally relating to the towing and removing of vehicles in Harford
County.
