(2) [Money] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (I) OF THIS
SECTION, MONEY payable in the event of sickness, accident, injury, or death of any
person, including compensation for loss of future earnings. This exemption includes
but is not limited to money payable on account of judgments, arbitrations,
compromises, insurance, benefits, compensation, and relief. Disability income benefits
are not exempt if the judgment is for necessities contracted for after the disability is
incurred
