## A BILL ENTITLED

Health Occupations - Dental Hygienists - Nitrous Oxide

1 AN ACT concerning

3	FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice dental hygiene" for purposes of
4	certain provisions of law governing dental hygienists to include administering
5	nitrous oxide and monitoring a patient to whom nitrous oxide is administered;
6	authorizing the State Board of Dental Examiners to adopt certain regulations;
7	altering the authority of the Board to adopt certain rules and regulations
8	concerning the administration of certain anesthesia by certain dental
9	hygienists; and generally relating to the practice of dental hygiene.
