## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning
Public Schools - Substitute Teachers - Qualifications, Training, and Study
FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to establish certain qualifications for substitute teachers employed by a county board; requiring a county board to require each substitute teacher to complete a certain orientation and training program; requiring county boards to train certain school administrators in certain issues related to substitute teachers; requiring a county superintendent to develop a certain in-service training program; requiring the State Department of Education to commission a certain study regarding substitute teaching in the State; requiring the study to include certain data; requiring the Department to submit a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to qualifications, training, and a study of substitute teachers in public schools.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Education
6-201.1.
(A) (1) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH QUALIFICATIONS FOR SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS EMPLOYED BY THE COUNTY BOARD.

(2) THE QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE THE SUBMISSION OF:
(I) A COMPLETE SET OF AN APPLICANT's FINGERPRINTS; AND
(II) Evidence of the Applicant's SUCCESSFUL GRADUATION FROM A REQUIRED EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION.
(B) A COUNTY BOARD SHALL REQUIRE EACH SUBSTITUTE TEACHER TO COMPLETE AN ORIENTATION AND TRAINING PROGRAM THAT INCLUDES:
(1) CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT TECHNIQUES;
(2) STRATEGIES FOR ADDRESSING VARIOUS STUDENT LEARNING NEEDS AND STYLES;
(3) SCHOOL SAFETY AND SECURITY PROCEDURES;
(4) TEACHER PROFESSIONALISM; AND
(5) AN OVERVIEW OF RELEVANT EDUCATION LAW.
(C) A COUNTY BOARD SHALL TRAIN SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, INCLUDING PRINCIPALS, IN:
(1) The best practices in recruiting and retaining EFFECTIVE SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS;
(2) THE USE OF PERMANENT SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS; AND
(3) Effectively integrating substitute teachers into SCHOOL OPERATIONS.
(D) The County superintendent shall develop a program of IN-SERVICE TRAINING FOR ALL PERMANENT TEACHERS ON THE BEST PRACTICES FOR PREPARING THE CLASSROOM FOR A SUBSTITUTE TEACHER, INCLUDING:
(1) Preparing students For a Substitute teacher;
(2) PROPER ACADEMIC PLANNING AND FOLLOW-UP; AND

## (3) DEVELOPMENT OF A SUBSTITUTE TEACHER RESOURCE KIT THAT INCLUDES:

(I) SHORT WHOLE-CLASS CRITICAL THINKING ACTIVITIES;
(II) INDEPENDENT STUDENT ACTIVITIES;
(III) TEACHER-DIRECTED ACTIVITIES; AND
(IV) LESSON PLANS ORGANIZED BY SUBJECT MATTER.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
(a) (1) The State Department of Education shall commission an independent study on the prevalence and effectiveness of substitute teaching in the State.
(2) The study conducted under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall include the following data from each local jurisdiction:
(i) demand for substitute teachers;
(ii) substitute teacher qualifications;
(iii) existing orientation and training programs for substitute teachers;
(iv) number of and types of complaints filed against substitute teachers; and
(v) percentage of time students are being instructed by substitute teachers.
(b) On or before June 30, 2012, the State Department of Education shall submit a report of its findings of the study conducted under this section, in accordance with § $2-1246$ of the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Committee on Ways and Means.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2011.
