A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Dedicated State Funds Protection Act

- 3 FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution 4 prohibiting certain transfers of dedicated State funds to the General Fund 5 except for certain purposes under certain circumstances; requiring the Governor 6 to include certain provisions in the budget that provide for the repayment of 7 certain dedicated State funds under certain circumstances within a certain 8 period of time; defining a certain term; and submitting this amendment to the 9 qualified voters of the State for their adoption or rejection.
- 10 BY proposing an addition to the Maryland Constitution

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses 14
- 15 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

- IN THIS SECTION, "DEDICATED STATE FUNDS" MEANS REVENUES 18 COLLECTED BY THE STATE THAT ARE DEDICATED BY LAW TO A SPECIFIC 19
- 20 PURPOSE.
- 21EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, **(B)** DEDICATED STATE FUNDS MAY BE USED ONLY FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSES 22

- 3 (C) DEDICATED STATE FUNDS MAY BE USED FOR DEFENSE OR RELIEF 4 PURPOSES IF:
- 5 (1) THE STATE IS INVADED BY LAND, SEA, OR AIR, OR A MAJOR 6 CATASTROPHE OCCURS;
 - (2) THE GOVERNOR:
- 8 (I) PROCLAIMS A STATE OF EMERGENCY;
- 9 (II) DECLARES THAT USE OF THE FUNDS FOR DEFENSE OR
 10 RELIEF PURPOSES IS NECESSARY FOR THE IMMEDIATE PRESERVATION OF THE
 11 PUBLIC HEALTH OR SAFETY; AND
- 12 (III) PROPOSES A PLAN TO REPAY THE DEDICATED STATE
 13 FUNDS WITHIN 5 YEARS AFTER THE USE OF THE FUNDS, FOR ANY AMOUNTS
 14 USED UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THIS SUBSECTION; AND
- 15 (3) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, BY LEGISLATION PASSED UPON A
 16 YEA AND NAY VOTE SUPPORTED BY THREE-FIFTHS OF ALL MEMBERS ELECTED
 17 TO EACH OF THE TWO HOUSES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, CONCURS THAT
 18 THE USE OF THE FUNDS FOR DEFENSE OR RELIEF PURPOSES IS NECESSARY AND
 19 APPROVES THE REPAYMENT PLAN PROPOSED BY THE GOVERNOR.
- 20 (D) IF THE GOVERNOR INCLUDES A PROVISION IN THE BUDGET TO
 21 TRANSFER OR DIVERT REVENUES FROM DEDICATED STATE FUNDS TO THE
 22 GENERAL FUND, THE GOVERNOR SHALL ALSO INCLUDE A PROVISION IN THE
 23 BUDGET THAT PROVIDES FOR THE REPAYMENT WITHIN 5 YEARS OF THAT
 24 TRANSFER OR DIVERSION TO THE DEDICATED STATE FUNDS FROM THE
 25 GENERAL FUND.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.
 - SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November, 2012 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution

- shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the
- 2 Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now
- 3 provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the
- 4 Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article
- 5 XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance with
- 6 Article XIV.
