#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Renewable Energy Portfolio Standard – Renewable Energy Credits – Solar Water Heating Systems

4 FOR the purpose of providing that energy from a certain solar water heating system is  $\mathbf{5}$ eligible for inclusion in meeting the renewable energy portfolio standard; 6 providing that a person that owns and operates a certain solar water heating 7 system shall receive a certain renewable energy credit under certain 8 circumstances; requiring the total amount of energy generated and consumed by 9 a nonresidential or commercial solar water heating system to be measured by a certain meter; requiring the total amount of energy generated and consumed by 10 a residential solar water heating system to be measured in a certain way; 11 12prohibiting a residential solar water heating system from producing more than 13 a certain number of solar renewable energy credits in any one year; defining a certain term; altering a certain definition; requiring that certain solar water 14 heating systems be installed in accordance with applicable State and local 1516 plumbing codes; providing for the application of this Act; providing for a delayed 17effective date; and generally relating to the eligibility of solar water heating 18 systems for inclusion in meeting the renewable energy portfolio standard.
