11	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15	(a) (1) A pharmacist may administer an influenza vaccination to an
16	individual, in accordance with regulations adopted under subsection (c) of this section.
17	(2) A pharmacist may administer a vaccination for pneumococcal
18	pneumonia or herpes zoster, or any vaccination that has been determined by the
19	Board, with the agreement of the Board of Physicians and the Board of Nursing to be
20	in the best health interests of the community, to an individual if:
21	(i) The individual is [an adult] AT LEAST 7 YEARS OLD;
22	(ii) The individual has a prescription from a physician;

1 The pharmacist informs the prescribing physician that the (iii) 2 vaccination has been administered; 3 If the prescribing physician is not the patient's primary care 4 physician, the pharmacist has made a reasonable effort to inform the patient's 5 primary care physician that the vaccination has been administered; and 6 The vaccination is administered in accordance with 7 regulations adopted under subsection (c) of this section. 8 The Board shall set reasonable fees for the administration of vaccinations (b) 9 in accordance with subsection (a) of this section. The Board, the Board of Physicians, and the Board of Nursing 10 (c) (1) shall meet at least annually to jointly develop, adopt, and review regulations to 11 12 provide for patient safety and to implement this section. 13 (2)The regulations adopted under paragraph (1) of this subsection 14 shall require a pharmacist to submit a registration form to the Board that includes 15 verification that the pharmacist: 16 Has successfully completed a certification course approved by the Board that included instruction in the guidelines and recommendations of the 17 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention regarding vaccinations; and 18 19 Is certified in basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation and (ii) 20 obtained the certification through in-person classroom instruction.
