A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Alcoholic Beverages – Landlords – Premises That Violate Minimum Distance Requirement from Schools or Churches

FOR the purpose of making it a misdemeanor for a landlord to rent out a premises to
be used for the sale of alcoholic beverages if the landlord knows or has reason to
know that the use would violate a certain minimum distance requirement
between a licensed premises and a church or school; providing a penalty; and
generally relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

18 (A) A LANDLORD MAY NOT RENT OUT A PREMISES TO BE USED FOR THE 19 SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IF THE LANDLORD KNOWS OR HAS REASON TO 20 KNOW THAT THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON THE PREMISES WOULD 21 VIOLATE A PROVISION IN THIS ARTICLE THAT REQUIRES A MINIMUM DISTANCE 22 TO BE MAINTAINED BETWEEN A LICENSED PREMISES AND A CHURCH OR 23 SCHOOL.



1 (B) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A 2 MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING 3 \$1,000.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2011.
