Charles County - Alcoholic Beverages - Class B-Stadium (Baseball Stadium) On-Sale Beer, Wine and Liquor License

4 FOR the purpose of altering a Class B-Stadium (baseball stadium) beer and light wine $\mathbf{5}$ license in Charles County to be a Class B-Stadium (baseball stadium) 6 on-sale beer, wine and liquor license; allowing a patron to consume and carry 7beer and wine anywhere on the premises of the baseball stadium; allowing a 8 patron to consume liquor only in the enclosed stadium dining area or bar and 9 prohibiting a patron from carrying liquor out of the enclosed stadium dining 10 area or bar; authorizing the Charles County Board of License Commissioners to 11 adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to the issuance of a Class 12B-Stadium (baseball stadium) on-sale beer, wine and liquor license in Charles 13 County.
