## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Public Employees' and Retirees' Benefit Sustainability Commission – Advance Directives

FOR the purpose of requiring the Public Employees' and Retirees' Benefit 4  $\mathbf{5}$ Sustainability Commission to study and make recommendations relating to the 6 completion of advance directives used to plan for future health care decisions by 7retirees of the State Retirement and Pension System; requiring the Commission 8 to submit certain reports to a certain commission, certain committees, and the 9 Office of the Attorney General on or before a certain date; and generally relating 10 to a study by the Public Employees' and Retirees' Benefit Sustainability Commission on the completion of advance directives used to plan for future 11 12health care decisions by retirees of the State Retirement and Pension System.

15 Section 46(g) and (h)

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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### Chapter 484 of the Acts of 2010

ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15, 2011, THE COMMISSION 13(3) 14SHALL ISSUE A REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS WITH 15**RESPECT TO METHODS TO FACILITATE AND ENCOURAGE MORE RETIREES OF** THE STATE RETIREMENT AND PENSION SYSTEM TO COMPLETE ADVANCE 16 17DIRECTIVES TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE 18STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE SENATE BUDGET AND TAXATION COMMITTEE, THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND ENVIRONMENTAL 1920AFFAIRS COMMITTEE, THE HOUSE HEALTH AND GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS THE HOUSE **APPROPRIATIONS** COMMITTEE, 21COMMITTEE, THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON PENSIONS, THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, AND THE 22BLUE RIBBON COMMISSION TO STUDY RETIREE HEALTH CARE FUNDING 2324**OPTIONS.**
