- FOR the purpose of expanding the crime of contaminating food with poison to include
 the knowing placement of a rodenticide or other substance used to kill rodents
 on or in contact with food that will be prepared for human consumption in a
 food service facility; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the crime
 of placing a rodenticide on food prepared for human consumption in a food
 service facility.

HOUSE BILL 1353

1 (a) A person may not knowingly and willfully contaminate, attempt to 2 contaminate, or conspire to contaminate the water of a source or tributary of a water 3 supply, including the waters of a well, spring, brook, lake, pond, stream, river, or 4 reservoir by adding disease germs, bacteria, poison, or poisonous matter, if the water 5 supply is used or is usable for drinking or domestic purposes.

6 (b) (1) (I) IN THIS SUBSECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE 7 THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

8 (II) "FOOD SERVICE FACILITY" HAS THE MEANING STATED 9 IN § 21–301(H) OF THE HEALTH–GENERAL ARTICLE.

10 (III) "POISON" INCLUDES A RODENTICIDE OR OTHER 11 SUBSTANCE USED TO KILL RODENTS.

12 (2) A person may not:

(I) knowingly and willfully contaminate, attempt to
 contaminate, or conspire to contaminate any drink, food, food product, or food supply
 by adding disease germs, bacteria, poison, or poisonous matter; OR

16 (II) IN A FOOD SERVICE FACILITY, KNOWINGLY PLACE
17 POISON ON OR IN CONTACT WITH FOOD THAT WILL BE PREPARED FOR HUMAN
18 CONSUMPTION.

19 (c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction is 20 subject to imprisonment not exceeding 20 years.

(i) A place where food or drink is prepared for sale or service on
the premises or elsewhere; or

1 (i) A kitchen in a private home where food is prepared at no 2 charge for guests in the home, for guests at a social gathering, or for service to 3 unemployed, homeless, or other disadvantaged populations;

4 (ii) A food preparation or serving area where only 5 nonpotentially hazardous food, as defined by the United States Food and Drug 6 Administration, is prepared or served only by an excluded organization; or

7 (iii) A location in a farmer's market where raw agricultural 8 products, as defined in § 21–304(d)(1)(iii) of this subtitle, are sold.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 10 October 1, 2011.
