## Caroline County - Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2011

- 3 FOR the purpose of increasing the number of times a Class BWTS beer and wine 4 (on-premises) tasting or sampling license may be granted in a calendar year to 5 a person in Caroline County; altering the hours of sale for certain licensees in 6 the county; requiring that a licensee in the county or an employee of the licensee 7 be certified by an approved alcohol awareness program and, except under 8 certain circumstances, be present during the hours in which alcohol may be 9 sold; making a stylistic change; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in 10 Caroline County.
