12	(1) THE THIRD SATURDAY IN MAY, FOR ARMED FORCES DAY;
13	(2) May 30, for Memorial Day;
14 15	[(2)] (3) the day that the United States Congress designates for the observance of Memorial Day if other than May 30;
16 17 18 19	[(3)] (4) the Saturday and Sunday that are closest to May 30, unless the United States Congress designates another day for the observance of Memorial Day, in which case, the Saturday and Sunday that are closest to the day designated by the United States Congress;

21 22	[(4)] (6) the third Friday in September, for POW/MIA Recognition Day;
