A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Environment – On–Site Sewage Disposal Systems – Nitrogen Removal

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting the installation of an on-site sewage disposal system in the State in the watersheds of the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays to service a newly constructed building unless the system utilizes nitrogen removal technology; and generally relating to on-site sewage disposal systems with nitrogen removal technology.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 22 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

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1 (2) "Nitrogen removal technology" means the best available technology 2 for the removal of nitrogen.

3 (3) "On-site sewage disposal system" means a sewage treatment unit, 4 collection system, disposal area, and related appurtenances.

A person may not:

6 (1) Install, or have installed, on property a person owns in the State in 7 the WATERSHEDS OF THE Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays [Critical Area,] an 8 on-site sewage disposal system to service a newly constructed building, unless the 9 on-site sewage disposal system utilizes nitrogen removal technology; or

10 (2) Replace or have replaced, an existing on-site sewage disposal 11 system on property a person owns in the State in the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal 12 Bays Critical Area, unless the replacement on-site sewage disposal system utilizes 13 nitrogen removal technology.

14 (c) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection and in accordance with 15 § 9–1605.2(h) of this title, the Department shall assist homeowners in paying the cost 16 difference between a conventional on-site sewage disposal system and a system that 17 utilizes nitrogen removal technology with money from the Bay Restoration Fund, if 18 sufficient funds are available.

19 (2) In calendar years 2010, 2011, and 2012, the Department shall 20 assist homeowners by paying 100% of the cost difference between a conventional 21 on-site sewage disposal system and a system that utilizes nitrogen removal technology 22 with money from the Bay Restoration Fund, if the homeowner:

(i) Is required under subsection (b)(2) of this section to replace
an existing on-site sewage disposal system with an on-site sewage disposal system
that utilizes nitrogen removal technology; and

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(ii) Has a failing on–site sewage disposal system.

(d) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person who violates
subsection (b) of this section is subject to the civil and administrative penalties and
the enforcement mechanisms provided in §§ 9–334 through 9–342 of this title.

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(2) The penalties imposed under this section may not exceed \$8,000.

The Department shall adopt regulations to implement this section.

32 (2) The regulations adopted in accordance with paragraph (1) of this 33 subsection shall include provisions to ensure that appropriate management measures 34 are provided for the operation and maintenance of nitrogen removal technology.

12 (2) The subtraction under subsection (a) of this section includes the 13 amount by which the cost difference between a conventional on-site sewage disposal 14 system and a system that utilizes nitrogen removal technology exceeds the amount of 15 assistance the Department of the Environment provides the homeowner under § 16 9-1108 of the Environment Article.
