CHAPTER

AN ACT concerning 1

## Recreational Fishing Licenses – Exemption for Disabled Armed Forces 2 3 **Members**

FOR the purpose of ereating an authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to 4 5 issue an annual exemption from the requirement to obtain a recreational 6 fishing license under certain circumstances for a person who serves in the armed forces and has a service-connected disability to a governmental entity or 8 nonprofit organization to take individuals serving or who have served in the 9 armed forces with physical or mental disabilities fishing in certain waters; providing that the exemption applies to certain individuals attending to a 10 certain disabled individual; requiring an application for the exemption to be submitted to the Department on a certain form; requiring a certain 12 governmental entity or nonprofit organization to submit a certain report 13 containing certain information within a certain time frame; clarifying that the 14 15 exemption applies to certain fishing activities; and generally relating to 16 exemptions from the requirement to obtain a recreational fishing license.
