- 2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "YOUNG HERO" MEANS A MINOR WHO IS 3 RECOGNIZED BY THE RESIDENTS OF THE STATE FOR THE POSITIVE 4 CONTRIBUTION THE MINOR HAS MADE TO SOCIETY.
- 5 (B) IN RECOGNITION OF THE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS THAT YOUNG HEROES HAVE MADE TO THE STATE, THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM THE FIRST MONDAY OF OCTOBER AS YOUNG HEROES DAY.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2011.
