1 AN ACT concerning

Election Law – Access to Voting Room and Voting Booth by Minors Not Eligible to Vote

- FOR the purpose of increasing the maximum age at which a minor may accompany a
 voter in the voting room and voting booth at a polling place under certain
 circumstances; and generally relating to access to the voting room and voting
 booth by minors at the polling place.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Election Law

16 10–308.

17 (a) An election judge shall allow the following individuals to have access to 18 the voting room at a polling place:

19 (1) a voter;

4	(4) a member or other representative of the State Board or local board;

17 18	(c) (1) Before a voter enters a voting booth, at the request of the voter, an election judge shall:
$\begin{array}{c} 19\\ 20 \end{array}$	(i) instruct the voter about the operation of the voting system; and
$\begin{array}{c} 21 \\ 22 \end{array}$	(ii) allow the voter an opportunity to operate a model voting device, if appropriate to the voting system in use.
$23 \\ 24 \\ 25$	(2) (i) 1. After a voter enters the voting booth, at the request of the voter, two election judges representing different political parties shall instruct the voter on the operation of the voting device.
$\begin{array}{c} 26 \\ 27 \end{array}$	2. An election judge may not suggest in any way how the voter should vote for a particular ticket, candidate, or position on a question.
28 29	3. After instructing the voter, the election judges shall exit the voting booth and allow the voter to vote privately.

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1 (ii) A voter may take into the polling place any written or 2 printed material to assist the voter in marking or preparing the ballot.

3 (3) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, a 4 voter who requires assistance in marking or preparing the ballot because of a physical 5 disability or an inability to read the English language may choose any individual to 6 assist the voter.

(ii) A voter may not choose the voter's employer or agent of that
employer or an officer or agent of the voter's union to assist the voter in marking the
ballot.

10 (4) If the voter requires the assistance of another in voting, but 11 declines to select an individual to assist, an election judge, in the presence of another 12 election judge that represents another political party, shall assist the voter in the 13 manner prescribed by the voter.

14 (5) An individual assisting a voter may not suggest in any way how 15 the voter should vote for a particular ticket, candidate, or position on a question.

16 (6) If a voter requires assistance under paragraph (4) or (5) of this 17 subsection, the election judge shall record, on a form prescribed by the State Board, 18 the name of the voter who required assistance and the name of the individual 19 providing assistance to the voter.

20 (7) Except as provided in paragraph (3) or (4) of this subsection, an 21 individual over the age of [12] **17** years may not accompany a voter into a voting 22 booth.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 24 October June 1, 2011.
