#### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Education – General Assembly Scholarships – Modification of Programs

3 FOR the purpose of altering the Senatorial and Delegate Scholarship Programs to 4 require that the money appropriated under the programs be awarded by the  $\mathbf{5}$ Office of Student Financial Assistance in the Maryland Higher Education 6 Commission; requiring the Office to ensure that the awards are distributed in a 7 certain manner and that certain student populations are served; requiring the 8 Office to adopt certain guidelines; requiring that certain awards be apportioned 9 among certain legislative districts; repealing certain provisions of law relating 10 to administering a certain examination for Senatorial Scholarships and 11 awarding Delegate Scholarships for part-time students; making certain stylistic 12changes; permitting certain recipients to continue to receive awards under 13certain circumstances; requiring that certain appropriations and unexpended appropriations in certain fiscal years for Senatorial and Delegate scholarships 14 15be transferred and distributed to the Office; and generally relating to modifying 16 the Senatorial and Delegate Scholarship Programs.

(d) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate program as provided in § 18–402(a) of this subtitle may hold the scholarship for 2 years if [he] THE RECIPIENT is a full-time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a) of this section, or may hold the scholarship for 4 years if [he] THE RECIPIENT is a part-time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (b) of this section.

(e) Each recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a private
postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national accrediting
association approved by the United States Department of Education:
