12 Preamble

WHEREAS, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble background, worked throughout his life serving freedom and advancing the public good as an entertainer, union leader, corporate spokesman, Governor of California, and President of the United States; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan served with honor and distinction for two terms as the 40th President of the United States and was elected to a second term by winning the confidence of 60% of the electorate and was victorious in 49 of the 50 states in the general election, including the State of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, In 1981, when President Reagan was inaugurated, he inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant inflation and high unemployment; and

WHEREAS, During his presidency, President Reagan worked in a bipartisan manner to enact his bold agenda of restoring accountability and common sense to



- government which lead to an unprecedented economic expansion and opportunity for millions of Americans; and
- WHEREAS, President Reagan's commitment to our armed forces contributed to the restoration of pride in the United States, her values and those cherished by the free world, and prepared the armed forces of the United States to meet the challenges of the 21st century; and
- WHEREAS, President Reagan's vision of "peace through strength" led to the end of the Cold War and the ultimate demise of the Soviet Union, guaranteeing basic human rights for millions of people; and
- WHEREAS, February 6, 2011, will be the 100th anniversary of President Reagan's birth and the seventh since his passing; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article State Government
- 15 **13–410.**
- 16 (A) THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM FEBRUARY 6 AS 17 RONALD REAGAN DAY.
- 18 (B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE ALL CITIZENS OF THE STATE OF 19 MARYLAND TO OBSERVE RONALD REAGAN DAY IN A PROPER MANNER.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011.
