18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 4 (a) (1) The Circuit Administrative Judge of the First Circuit may 5 establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in one or more of the juvenile courts in 6 Dorchester County, Somerset County, Wicomico County, and Worcester County.
- 7 (2) THE CIRCUIT ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE OF THE SECOND 8 CIRCUIT MAY ESTABLISH A TRUANCY REDUCTION PILOT PROGRAM IN THE 9 JUVENILE COURT IN TALBOT COUNTY.
- 10 **[**(2)**] (3)** The Circuit Administrative Judge of the Third Circuit may establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in the juvenile court in Harford County.
- 12 **[**(3)**] (4)** The Circuit Administrative Judge of the Seventh Circuit 13 may establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in the juvenile court in Prince 14 George's County.
- 15 (b) After consultation with the administrative judges of the first, **SECOND**, 16 third, and seventh circuits, the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals may accept a gift 17 or grant to implement the pilot programs in each respective circuit.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2011.
