1 AN ACT concerning

2 <u>Baltimore County and</u> Prince George's County – Orphans' Court Judges – 3 Qualifications

FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to
prescribe different qualifications for judges of the Orphans' Court for <u>Baltimore</u>
<u>County and</u> Prince George's County; requiring judges of the Orphans' Court for
<u>Baltimore County and</u> Prince George's County to have been admitted to practice
law in this State and be members in good standing of the Maryland Bar; and
submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State for their
adoption or rejection.

SENATE BILL 281

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses 3 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

Article IV – Judiciary Department

5 40.

6 (a) The qualified voters of the several Counties, except Montgomery County;
7 PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, and Harford County, shall elect three Judges of the
8 Orphans' Courts of Counties who shall be citizens of the State and residents, for the
9 twelve months preceding, in the County for which they may be elected.

10 (b) The qualified voters of the City of Baltimore shall elect three Judges of 11 the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City who shall be citizens of the State and residents, 12 for the twelve months preceding, in Baltimore City and who have been admitted to 13 practice law in this State and are members in good standing of the Maryland Bar.

14 (C) THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF BALTIMORE COUNTY SHALL ELECT 15 THREE JUDGES OF THE ORPHANS' COURT FOR BALTIMORE COUNTY WHO 16 SHALL BE CITIZENS OF THE STATE AND RESIDENTS, FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS 17 PRECEDING, IN BALTIMORE COUNTY AND WHO HAVE BEEN ADMITTED TO 18 PRACTICE LAW IN THIS STATE AND ARE MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING OF THE 19 MARYLAND BAR.

(C) (D) (C) THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY
SHALL ELECT THREE JUDGES OF THE ORPHANS' COURT FOR PRINCE
GEORGE'S COUNTY WHO SHALL BE CITIZENS OF THE STATE AND RESIDENTS,
FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS PRECEDING, IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY AND
WHO HAVE BEEN ADMITTED TO PRACTICE LAW IN THIS STATE AND ARE
MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING OF THE MARYLAND BAR.

26 [(c)] (D) (E) (D) The Judges shall have all the powers now vested in the 27 Orphans' Courts of the State, subject to such changes as the Legislature may 28 prescribe.

29 [(d)] (E) (E) Each of the Judges shall be paid such compensation as may
 30 be regulated by Law, to be paid by the City or Counties, respectively.

[(e)] (F) (G) (F) In case of a vacancy in the office of Judge of the Orphans'
Court, the Governor shall appoint, subject to confirmation or rejection by the Senate,
some suitable person to fill the vacancy for the residue of the term.

34 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 35 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act

affects only one county <u>multiple jurisdictions</u> only one county and that the provisions
 of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of
 constitutional amendments <u>do not</u> apply.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section 4 proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the $\mathbf{5}$ qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November, 2012 6 7for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. 8 At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution 9 shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now 10 11 provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the 12Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article 13XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance with 14Article XIV.
