BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Education Section 7–203.2 Annotated Code of Maryland (2008 Replacement Volume and 2010 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Education
