## 2 Environment – Phosphorus – Commercial Dishwashing Detergent

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from using, selling, manufacturing, or distributing for sale certain commercial dishwashing detergents that contain greater than a certain amount of phosphorus after a certain date; repealing certain obsolete language; and generally relating to phosphorus in commercial dishwashing detergents.

- 17 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a person may not use, sell, manufacture, or distribute for use or sale within the State any cleaning agent that contains more than 0.0 percent phosphorus by weight expressed as elemental phosphorus except for an amount not exceeding 0.5 percent phosphorus that is incidental to manufacturing.
- 22 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person may use, sell, 23 manufacture, or distribute for use or sale a cleaning agent that contains greater than

phosphorus by weight.
