1 2 3	(c) In Carroll County, Charles County, [Frederick County,] Harford County, and Washington County, a person may not stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind from the occupant of a vehicle.
4	(K) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY IN FREDERICK COUNTY.
