For a used vehicle, the vehicle's model year. 25(ii) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any vehicle 26 registered under this section before June 1, 1994 may continue to be operated until 27 June 1, 1999 under the applicable provisions of law in effect on May 31, 1994. 28 (2)A vehicle may continue to be registered under this section, (i) 29 regardless of the vehicle's configuration, and to be operated under the same administrative regulations that were in effect on June 1, 1994, for the applicable time 30 31 periods specified in paragraph (1) of this subsection, if the vehicle: 32

- 2. Is a three—axle vehicle that on June 1, 1994 was in the inventory of a dealer licensed under Title 15 of this article and was sold and registered before June 1, 1995.
- 4 (ii) Subparagraph (i) of this paragraph does not apply to flat bed 5 trucks used to haul concrete blocks.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2011.
