## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Elections - Permanent Absentee Ballot List

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Elections to establish guidelines for a 4 permanent absentee ballot list; authorizing an individual to apply for 5 permanent absentee ballot status; authorizing an application for permanent 6 absentee ballot status to be made by certain methods; requiring a written 7 request for permanent absentee ballot status to include certain information; 8 requiring that a voter be placed on the permanent absentee ballot list under 9 certain circumstances; requiring that an absentee ballot be sent to a voter on 10 the permanent absentee ballot list for certain elections; requiring that a voter 11 be removed from the permanent absentee ballot list under certain 12 circumstances; requiring a voter who has permanent absentee ballot status to 13 notify the local board with certain information under certain circumstances; and generally relating to permanent absentee ballot lists. 14

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ABSENTEE BALLOT WAS SENT.
