4 (D) SUBJECT TO <u>THE CONSENT OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE</u> 5 <u>COUNTY AND</u> THE WRITTEN APPROVAL OF THE SECRETARY, A HEALTH OFFICER 6 <u>FOR A COUNTY</u> MAY ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OR ANY OTHER WRITTEN 7 AGREEMENT TO ASSIST OR PARTICIPATE IN THE DELIVERY OF HEALTH CARE 8 SERVICES WITH A PERSON THAT IS AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE, FINANCE, 9 COORDINATE, FACILITATE, OR OTHERWISE DELIVER HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN 10 THE STATE.

11 [(d)] (E) The Secretary may delegate duties, powers, and functions as 12 provided in this article to a health officer for a county or other county official 13 authorized to administer and enforce health and environmental laws.
