11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

# Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings

14 3–1508.

15 (a) An individual who fails to comply with the relief granted in an interim 16 peace order under § 3–1503.1 of this subtitle, a temporary peace order under § 17 3–1504(a)(2) of this subtitle, or a final peace order under § 3–1505(d)(1)(i), (ii), (iii), or 18 (iv) of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject [, for each 19 offense,] to:

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1 (1) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or 2 imprisonment not exceeding 90 days or both; AND

#### 3 (2) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, A FINE NOT 4 EXCEEDING \$2,500 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH.

5 (b) A law enforcement officer shall arrest with or without a warrant and take 6 into custody an individual who the officer has probable cause to believe is in violation 7 of an interim peace order, temporary peace order, or final peace order in effect at the 8 time of the violation.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 October 1, 2011.
