1 AN ACT concerning

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Nonpublic Schools Accepting State Funds <u>That Participate in State</u> <u>Programs</u> – Bullying, Harassment, and Intimidation – Policies

4 FOR the purpose of requiring nonpublic schools that accept State funds participate in 5 State programs to adopt a policy prohibiting bullying, harassment, and 6 intimidation by a certain date; requiring the policy to include certain provisions; 7 encouraging a nonpublic school to develop the policy in consultation with 8 certain groups; encouraging a nonpublic school to publicize the policy in a 9 certain manner; encouraging a nonpublic school to develop certain educational 10 programs in its efforts to prevent bullying, harassment, and intimidation; 11 providing that certain nonpublic school employees who report acts of bullying, 12 harassment, or intimidation are not civilly liable under certain circumstances; 13 providing that this Act may not be construed to limit the legal rights of a victim of bullying, harassment, or intimidation; defining certain terms; and generally 14 relating to policies prohibiting bullying, harassment, and intimidation in 15 16 nonpublic schools that accept State funds participate in State programs.

 26 THAT TRAINS TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS TO IMPLEMENT THE POLICY
 27 ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
- 28 (G) AN EMPLOYEE OF A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL WHO REPORTS AN ACT OF
 29 BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
 30 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL'S POLICY ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
 31 SECTION IS NOT CIVILLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION IN REPORTING OR

FAILING TO REPORT AN ACT OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POLICY.
(H) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT THE LEGAL RIGHTS OF A VICTIM OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OF INTIMIDATION.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2011.
