A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – School Buses – Prohibition on Permitting Sitting on Floor or**
3 **Standing**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person who is responsible for pupils on a school bus
5 from permitting any pupil to stand while the bus is in motion; prohibiting a
6 person who is responsible for pupils on a school bus from permitting any pupil
7 to sit on the floor of the school bus; establishing that this Act does not apply
8 during a certain period of time at the beginning of a school year for public
9 schools or, under certain circumstances, in an emergency; making certain
10 conforming changes; and generally relating to a prohibition on permitting pupils
11 to sit on the floor or stand on a school bus.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Transportation**

20 21–1118.

21 (a) The driver of a school bus:

22 (1) Is responsible for its operation; and

23 (2) May not drive it into any roadway without first stopping and
24 determining that there is no danger from any other vehicle.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1 (b) The person responsible for any pupils on a school bus is:

2 (1) The teacher on the bus; or

3 (2) If a teacher is not present, the driver.

4 [(c) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit the
5 number of standing pupils to exceed one pupil for each part of the aisle that is
6 bounded on both sides by forward facing seats.

7 (d) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any pupil
8 to stand if the school bus is equipped only with lengthwise or a combination of
9 lengthwise and forward facing seats.]

10 (c) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
11 SUBSECTION, A PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR PUPILS ON A SCHOOL BUS MAY NOT
12 PERMIT ANY PUPIL TO STAND WHILE THE BUS IS IN MOTION.

13 (2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY DURING:

14 (i) THE FIRST 10 SCHOOL DAYS OF A SCHOOL YEAR FOR
15 PUBLIC SCHOOLS AS DEFINED IN § 1-201 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE; OR

16 (ii) AN EMERGENCY, IF PERMITTING A PUPIL TO STAND
17 WHILE A SCHOOL BUS IS IN MOTION IS NECESSARY IN ORDER TO TRANSPORT
18 PUPILS TO A SAFE LOCATION.

19 [(e) (D) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any
20 pupil to stand in front of the stanchion and guardrail.

21 [(f) (E) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any
22 pupil to operate the front door opening mechanism, except in an emergency.

23 [(g) (F) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not require OR
24 PERMIT any pupil to sit on the floor.

25 [(h) (G) Except for the driver and any fuel station attendant, a person may
26 not occupy a school bus while it is being supplied with fuel.

27 [(i) (H) Either the driver or an adult aide assigned to each school vehicle
28 that is used to transport handicapped children shall be certified as having successfully
29 completed a first aid-safety course approved by the Department of Education.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
31 October 1, 2011.
