## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Political Subdivisions - Legal Notice Requirements - Posting on Web Sites

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a county or municipality to satisfy a requirement to 4 publish legal notices in a newspaper of general circulation by posting the notices 5 on its Web site; requiring notices posted on a county or municipality Web site to 6 be displayed conspicuously and easily accessible; requiring a county or 7 municipality that chooses to post notices on the Internet to publish certain 8 advance notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the county or 9 municipality and to offer a certain mail service to provide paper copies of 10 notices; requiring the mail service to provide paper copies of notices posted to 11 the county's or municipality's Web site; providing that the mail subscription 12 shall be valid for a certain period of time and may be renewed; requiring a 13 county or municipality to provide information about the mail service on its Web 14 site and in certain notices; requiring a county or municipality to maintain paper 15 copies of notices posted on its Web site and to make the copies available to the 16 public; requiring a county or municipality to maintain an affidavit stating 17 certain information about the posting of a notice on its Web site; providing that 18 the affidavit is not required to be notarized; providing that certain taxing authorities may meet certain notice requirements relating to real property tax 19 20 rates by providing certain information to the State Department of Assessments 21 and Taxation regarding the taxing authority's Web site and by posting certain 22 information on the Web site; and generally relating to publication of legal 23 notices by counties and municipalities.

6 7 8	WHEREAS, There has been a steady decline in newspaper readership in the past several decades, while at the same time there has been a significant increase in the number of households with access to the Internet; and
9 10 11	WHEREAS, Baltimore City, the 23 counties in Maryland, and many municipalities maintain official government Web sites that are accessible to the public 24 hours a day; and
12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, Many legal notices published solely in newspapers go unread and unnoticed by the public because casual newspaper readers generally do not read the legal notice section but instead follow local government issues through the Internet; and
16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, Allowing the publication of legal notices on official government Web sites, while still giving the option to receive notice by mail, will make those notices more easily accessible to a greater number of people, thereby promoting increased public participation in government; and
20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, Like the State, many political subdivisions in Maryland will face significant fiscal challenges for fiscal year 2012, including static or declining property tax revenues, a 62% decrease in State aid from fiscal year 2007 levels (back to the appropriate funding levels in 1984), and potentially significant new federal and State mandates; and
25 26 27	WHEREAS, Every dollar spent on publishing legal notices in newspapers places further stress on local budgets, and the counties and Baltimore City can save millions annually if they were to publish via the Internet; now, therefore,
28 29	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 15	(b) (2) A taxing authority does not meet the requirements of this section until it provides to the Department:
16 17 18	(i) on or before 15 days after the date of the advertisement required by this section a copy of the entire newspaper page that carried the meeting notice required by this section; [or]
19 20	(ii) the evidence that the Department requires of the mailing of the notices described in subsection (c) of this section; <b>OR</b>
21 22 23 24	(III) BEFORE TO THE DATE OF POSTING, THE LINK TO THE TAXING AUTHORITY'S WEB SITE WHERE THE NOTICE WILL BE POSTED IF THE TAXING AUTHORITY ELECTS TO POST NOTICE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (C)(3) OF THIS SECTION.
25 26 27	(c) If a taxing authority intends to set a county or municipal corporation real property tax rate that exceeds the constant yield tax rate, it shall advertise to the public by:
28 29 30	(1) placing an advertisement that satisfies the Department and meets the requirements of this section in a newspaper of general circulation in the jurisdiction of the taxing authority; [or]

(2) mailing a notice that meets the requirements of this section to each property taxpayer who resides in the jurisdiction; **OR**
